What is "Title I"?

Title I is the federal program that provides funding to local school districts to improve the academic achievement of disadvantaged students. It is part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act first passed in 1965.

The focus of the Title I program is on helping all students meet the same high standards expected of all children.

Schools receive Title I funds based on the number of free/reduced lunch population (40% or more)

All Students at Wrightsboro receive free lunch
